#### \$53,500 Awarded in 2016

The New Salem Area Community Foundation was created to be a resource to support local community initiatives which provide a higher quality of life in New Salem and the surrounding area. The Foundation has awarded a total of \$262,966 in 20 different grants to a variety of organizations since its inception.

Last year, the Foundation's Advisory Committee awarded \$53,500 to five different organizations:

- \$33,865 to the City of New Salem to help replace the auditorium floor
- \$10,000 to the New Salem Fire Department for turnout gear
- \$5,885 to the New Salem Park District for swimming pool repairs
- \$3,250 to the Missouri Slope Areawide United Way to start a Dolly Parton Imagination Library in New Salem
- \$500 to the American Legion for the American Flag Project

Grants are awarded once a year. Any organization with a 501(c)(3) status or government agency may apply. Applications are available online at www.NDCF.net/NewSalem and due by March 15. ◊

#### **Estate Gift Benefits Area Forever**



Mary "May" Singh of Hazen, North Dakota, passed away unexpectedly in 2014 from injuries sustained in an automobile accident. She and her husband Harjeet had lived in Hazen since 1977. Thanks to a lasting gift from

her estate, May will continue to impact her community forever.

May established a Charitable Remainder Uni-Trust at NDCF and upon her death, the remainder of the trust was used to create two new funds:

- The Singh Family Endowment Fund, which provides charitable income to the specific charities May indicated: the Bismarck-Mandan Chapter of the Salvation Army, the Hazen Dollars for Scholars program, and Mercer County Senior Citizens Organizations.
- The Singh Family Unrestricted Endowment Fund, which provides grants to nonprofit agencies across North Dakota every year. Grants from the fund are determined by the NDCF Board of Directors.

#### **Grants Make a Difference**

Each year we like to highlight one nonprofit in the area as an example of what the community foundation does to improve the quality of life in the New Salem area. The key with the fund is that it is overseen by a local committee - your neighbors - so the grants will always and only be given to the area service organizations that need it the most. It is flexible, so from year to year, as the needs change so can the grants to meet those community needs.

The NSACF decided to support as one of multiple awardees last year The Dolly Parton Imagination Library in partnership with MSA United Way. United Way acts as the fiscal sponsor, and provides the administration of getting the books to the kids 0-5 years of age. Eligible children in New Salem who register are mailed an age-appropriate book every month for

one year. The hope is that family members will read to the child on a regular basis when they are young and encourage a lifelong love of reading.



"Studies show that children who are read to advance considerably greater compared to those who are not. Children who do not read proficiently by the 3rd grade are four times more likely to drop out of school later in life," says Jena Gullo, Executive Director of the Missouri Slope United Way. "We are grateful to the available funding from the foundation so when there is a financial need, we know the foundation is there as a consistent base to draw from."

Your gifts to the New Salem Area Community Foundation fund programs like these. As the fund grows, it can support programs like this one or others. Imagine if the fund was large enough to ensure funding for this program long-term! With an additional \$175,000 in donations, that could happen. This is why it is important for the community to build the fund so it can have a greater impact!  $\Diamond$
